What does SRTS look like?




Safe Routes to School (SRTS) is an international movement—and now a federal program—to make it safe, convenient, and fun for children, including those with disabilities, to bicycle and walk to school. When routes are safe, walking or biking to and from school is an easy way to get the regular physical activity children need for good health.

Safe Routes to School initiatives also help ease traffic jams and air pollution, unite neighborhoods, and contribute to students' readiness to learn in school.





Non-Infrastructure Components, the "E's"

Education – Teaching students and community members about the broad range of transportation choices, and making sure they have the skills and know-how to be safe from traffic and crime while walking, bicycling,

and using public transportation.

CCSD is interested in: incorporating a bike corral to teach students how to navigate traffic situations safely, providing a Safety and Wellness Event to educate students on pedestrian/bike safety and the associated health benefits, and organizing a district-wide safety town that teaches children how to navigate different traffic situations

Encouragement – Using events and activities to promote walking, bicycling, public transportation, and

physical activity.

CCSD is interested in: an incentive program for students walking and biking to school, providing a trained adult as a walking school bus to meet students at a designated spot and escort them to school, using school related events and after-schools activities to access safe routes, and having students paint rocks to place along the designated safe routes

Enforcement – Partnering with local law enforcement to address traffic and crime concerns in the neighborhoods around schools and along school routes, while ensuring that law enforcement builds trust with communities.

CCSD is interested in: providing supplies and training for safety patrol and crossing guards, having local partners and training for safety patrol and crossing guards, having local partners and training for safety patrol and crossing guards.

Engineering – Making physical improvements to the streetscape and built environment that decrease the risk of injury from motor vehicles and discourage crime and violence, increasing street safety for all.

























